deep truths about the gospel, he sent his personal greetings to more than 25 individuals and the people associated with them. His co-workers joined him in sending their greetings. They obviously treasured the friendship of the saints. Priscilla and Aquila were not only friends of Paul but an outstanding couple, serving the Lord together. Their relationship must have been extraordinary, for they are always mentioned together.

Loving relationships! They enrich our individual lives. They encourage us in our Christian faith.

They vitalize our churches. Give yourself to developing loving relationships and you will be greatly blessed. --HVL




