He has given me the duty to teach them the fear of the Lord (Ps. 128). He has asked me to bring them up in the nurture and admonition of the Lord without exasperating them (Eph. 6:4). He has allowed me to share the heritage of faith. And for my efforts I get lots of hugs and kisses, really beaut Father's Day cards, and the chance to hear, "Hey, Dad!"
