in 1 Corinthians 7 is the question of marrying or not marrying. Some people were saying it wasn't right for Christians to marry---.... So Paul set the record straight.

Verse 1 is not the commandment we 9-year-olds thought it was. It's probably a restatement of the issue the Corinthian people had written to him about. His answer begins with verse 2: Marriage is the institution God provided to help keep people sexually pure. It gives a man and a woman the only godly relationship for the expression of sexual intimacy.

Should everyone get married, though? Not necessarily, Paul indicated in verse 8. Yet one thing is clear: If a Christian cannot tolerate the life of sexual abstinence as a single, he or she should seek God's guidance in finding a mate. Sexual intimacy outside marriage is **always** wrong.

Serving God is not reserved exclusively for either the single or the married. Both should do God's will. Paul said that "each man has his own gift from God" (v.9). ... --DB
