think of being accountable for each word you say!

We live in an "anything goes" world-and some people might wonder what difference our words make. They might question why it matters that we allow some words and consider others to be unacceptable. Let's look at some standards from the Bible.

- Speak the truth in love (Psalm 15:2; 34:13; Ephesians 4:15).
- Do not slander others (Psalm 15:3).
- Praise God; don't speak evil (James 3:10).
- Be wise; don't talk when you shouldn't (Proverbs 10:19).
- Avoid corrupt words (Ephesians 4:29); speak pleasant ones (Proverbs 16:24).

The overriding idea behind knowing what kinds of words to say is found in Psalm 19:14, where David said, "May the words of my mouth and the meditation of my heart be pleasing in Your sight, O Lord." If any other kinds of words pass through our lips, let's stomp them out! -DB

My daughter Julie and her friend Alyssa have been stomping around on the gym floor at school. Even though they were team mates on their district champion basketball team, this has nothing to do with bad calls by the ref or missed shots.

Instead, it's a little ritual they've developed to remind themselves of a great biblical principle based on Proverbs 16:24, "Pleasant words are a honeycomb" and its converse, "Do not let any unwholesome talk come out of your mouths" (Ephesians 4:29).

Julie and Alyssa decided that one way to remind themselves that only good words should come out of their mouths is to "stomp out" any words they know they shouldn't say.

For instance, if they say something they shouldn't about someone else, they go into the gym and stomp out those words. It may seem silly, but
