own churches because so many churches today are feeding their people with shallow, catchy, heavily illustrated sermons with clever sayings that tickle ears. Much of 'Christian Television' is an example of this. I have personally seen sermons on Christian television where the audiences seem enthralled and are taking copious notes from material that has almost no biblical root whatsoever! It is amazing to watch people so deceived that they are hungrily eating what they think is 'meat', but is really the latest psychology with a Scripture or two attached for dressing! The apostle Paul encourages us to 'renounce the hidden things of dishonesty, not walking in craftiness, nor handling the word of God deceitfully; but by manifestation of the truth commending ourselves to every man's conscience in the sight of God. But if our gospel be hid, it is hid to them that are lost: In whom the god of this world has blinded the minds of them which believe not, lest the light of the glorious gospel of Christ, who is the image of God, should shine unto them. For we preach not ourselves, but Christ Jesus the Lord; and ourselves your servants for Jesus' sake', (2Cor.4:2-5).

Paul here encourages 'honesty' in handling the word of God as well as the courage to challenge peoples minds, (vs.2). Our understanding must be this: - the gospel is naturally 'hidden' to the unsaved because Satan has 'blinded' their eyes, (vs.3,4). We cannot therefore naturally entice people with modern craftily built methods in handling the word of God. ..

Many churches today simply do not believe that the word of God in itself alone has enough power to literally change lives. This is seen in the methods and new programmes churches today so easily adopt. They have subtly concluded that the gap between the glory of Christ and the felt needs of the human in this age, is simply too great for the fullness of God's word to overcome. The result is a 'reduction' of the Word of God. I realize many of the ways we 'do church' are adapted to the culture but what we teach and preach must be strictly biblical. Culture does not define the word of God; the word of God overrides and must speak *to the culture*. *The Bible is the only inspired and infallible revelation of God*.
