

It is perilously possible to mistake the exposition of the truth for the truth; to run away with the idea that because we are able to expound these things, we are living them too."

James reminds us that the person "who looks into the perfect law of liberty and continues in it, and is not a forgetful hearer but a doer of the work, this one will be blessed in what he does" (1:25). The key issue is not what is preached or written, but what is *done*.


What Will I Do?

The NT describes the process of godly change in three simultaneous actions:

1. Restrain your ______,

James 1:1-21

(Romans 13:12-13) "The night is far spent, the day is at hand. Therefore let us cast off the works of darkness, and let us put on the armor of light.

[13] Let us walk properly, as in the day, not in revelry and drunkenness, not in lewdness and lust, not in strife and envy."

(Ephesians 4:22) "that you put off, concerning your former conduct, the old man which grows corrupt according to the deceifful lusts,"

(Ephesians 4:25) "Therefore, putting away lying, "Let each one of you speak truth with his neighbor," for we are members of one another."

(Colossians 3:8-9) "But now you yourselves are to put off all these: anger, wrath, malice, blasphemy, filthy language out of your mouth. [9] Do not lie to one another, since you have put off the old man with his deeds."

(1 Peter 2:1-2) "Therefore, laying aside all malice, all deceit, hypocrisy, envy, and all evil speaking, {2} as newborn babes, desire the pure milk of the word, that you may grow thereby,"





3. Reflect your ______, James 1:22-25

(Romans 13:13-14) "Let us walk properly, as in the day, not in revelry and drunkenness, not in lewdness and lust, not in strife and envy. {14} But put on the Lord Jesus Christ, and make no provision for the flesh, to fulfill its lusts."

(Ephesians 4:23-24) "and be renewed in the spirit of your mind, [24] and that you put on the new man which was created according to God, in true righteousness and holiness."

(Colossians 3:9-10) "Do not lie to one another, since you have put off the old man with his deeds, {10} and have put on the new man who is renewed in knowledge according to the image of Him who created him,"

(Hebrews 12:1-2) "Therefore we also, since we are surrounded by so great a cloud of witnesses, let us lay aside every weight, and the sin which so easily ensnares us, and let us run with endurance the race that is set before us, {2} looking unto Jesus, the author and finisher of our faith, who for the joy that was set before Him endured the cross, despising the shame, and has sat down at the right hand of the throne of God."

(John 15:2) ""Every branch in Me that does not bear fruit He takes away; and every branch that bears fruit He prunes, that it may bear more fruit."
