sight. If the waves built up or dark clouds began to gather, he hurried to the dock. Let a fog start to roll in and he was back--in spite of having the latest equipment.

The third boat owner would rather be out to sea than anywhere. He never bothered to check a weather report, and an approaching storm excited him. He seemed happiest being behind the wheel with the waves crashing and the wind howling. He and his boat had been through a lot together. He called it "Wave Dancer" and he knew what it could do. Storms did not frighten him.

When it comes to the life of faith, some young believers don't trust enough to even cast off from the dock. They stay where it's safe and secure. Others make quick little jaunts out into the deeper waters of Christian experience, but they scamper back as soon as things start getting a little tough. Still others have ridden the rough seas of life with Christ their Pilot. They know by experience that He will not leave them, and that He keeps every one of the promises of His Word. They trust Him most when the storm blows the hardest.




