my life: parents, teachers, youth leaders, friends, room mates. Seeing the trouble I was heading for, they stubbornly stood in my way, doing their best to prevent me from making foolish choices.

Did I thank them? Not very often. I was too busy pouting because they had kept me from getting something I thought I couldn't live without.

Taking a stand between friends and their destructive choices will seldom make you a popular person, but it will make you a good person. Your friends may even call you a traitor, but God will call you His friend. Emotionally and socially, it's a difficult choice to make. But intellectually and spiritually, it's a no-brainer. --JAL
