5. We are for faith. (V6-9)  1 Peter 1:9 "You are receiving the salvation of your souls. It is the result of your faith." (NIRV)  James 1:3 Knowing that the testing of your faith produces patience.  Job 23:10 But He (God) knows the way that I take; When He has tested me, I shall come forth as gold.  James 1:2 My brethren, count it all joy when you fall into various trials,
