Those words can be applied to the lives of unhappy multitudes of people who feel lonely and unloved. They may try to reach out and make friends, but their best efforts often prove futile.

Romans has a message for any of us who, like that woman, feel we belong to that frustrated legion of the lonely and unloved. It includes, of course, the good news about the Friend who cared enough to die as our substitute on the cross. But it's also about the Friend who loves each Christian with a love that can never be alienated, who sticks closer than a brother, and who understands us completely.

That friend is Jesus Christ, to all who have turned to Him in genuine repentance and faith. When in faith we reach out and grasp His downstretched, nail-pierced hand, we are gripped by the love that will never let us go.

No one ever cared for me like Jesus,
There's no other friend so kind as He;
No one else could take the sin and darkness from me,
Oh, how much He cared for me. —Weigle

Though human friendships may sometimes fail, Christ's friendship will always prevail.


