With a growing calmness, Carol opened her eyes to see the warm smile of her good friend Marge. Her friend's arms encircled her in a big wonderful hug. And Carol felt like God Himself was holding her tightly in His embrace.

Sometimes God uses us to demonstrate His love to other Christians. "In Christ we who are many form one body, and each member belongs to all the others. We have different gifts, according to the grace given us" (Romans 12:5-6). We serve others "with the strength God provides, so that in all things God may be praised through Jesus Christ" (1 Peter 4:11).

Sometimes that means just being there when a friend's mother dies. Or team-teaching a Sunday school class with an over-burdened friend. Or taking homework to someone who is sick. Or being available when that Christian brother or sister needs someone to listen or to give a hug.

If we are going to be available to God for ministry like that, we can't pack our days so full that when we get a call from a friend we are unable to respond. It may mean in our busy lives of going to school and working that we'll have to re-sort our priorities.

Instead of just asking for God's blessing on your planned agenda, maybe you should ask Him, "Lord, what would You like me to do today? -CK


