(Romans 15:1-2) "We then who are strong ought to bear with the scruples of the weak, and not to please ourselves. {2} Let each of us please his neighbour for his good, leading to edification."





(Galatians 5:13) "For you, brethren, have been called to liberty; only do not use liberty as an opportunity for the flesh, but through love serve one another." (Galatians 6:2) "Bear one another's burdens, and so fulfill the law of Christ."
