turned out the light at night with anger smouldering in our hearts? Oh, we probably intend to resolve the conflict eventually, but not now. *Let the other person suffer awhile in silence*, we think. But if we dealt with heartbroken survivors as often as Mr. Lynch, it would change the way we think and act.

"Do not let the sun go down on your wrath, nor give place to the devil," the Bible counsels (Eph. 4:26-27). "Be kind to one another, tenderhearted, forgiving one another, even as God in Christ forgave you" (v.32). The issue is not what others have done to us, but what Christ has done for us.

There's no better time than right now to apologise or offer forgiveness, and to restore a priceless relationship. The undertaker knows. --DCM

What keeps me from taking care of my anger immediately? What do I do when another person does not respond to attempts at reconciliation? See Romans 12:17-21.

Be slow to anger and quick to repent.


A Word From The Undertaker


