labeling. Since then, governments have passed laws to help protect the consumer by assuring the quality of products from food to perfume. They require standardized labeling and strict safety tests.

When I think about such laws as these, I am reminded that we should appreciate good government. Chaos would reign without it! Laws must be enforced to safeguard the health and well-being of the public.

In a day when government is often severely criticized, let us remember that "there is no authority except from God, and the authorities that exist are appointed by God" (Romans 13:1).

Thank God for the higher powers who are His ministers for our good (v.4). And ask Him to give wisdom to our leaders as they serve. —RWD




