always be a public area that is vulnerable to .. attacks."

In a world where violence and terrorism may strike anytime, any place, where can we find security? Where can we be safe?

The Bible says that our security is not in human protection but in God Himself. The book of Psalms contains more than 40 references to taking refuge in the Lord, many of them from David's experience of being pursued by his enemies. In his prayers for help, he centred his hope in the Lord: "You have been my defence and refuge in the day of my trouble. To You, O my Strength, I will sing praises; for God is my defence, my God of mercy" (Psalm 59:16-17).

God doesn't guarantee to protect us from difficulty and physical harm, but He does promise to be our refuge in every situation. In Him we find real security. —

Though danger lurks on every side, In Christ our Lord we will abide; Our God is strong, our hope is sure— In Him alone we are secure! —Fitzhugh
