cross over them into sin just so our friends will feel more comfortable. The life of Lot provides a sad lesson.

Lot had chosen the land of Sodom and Gomorrah (Genesis 13). Although he had Uncle Abram as an example of faith, Lot apparently had little influence on the people in his home town. By Genesis 18, God was ready to destroy the two towns because of their wickedness.

As you read Genesis 19, notice how Lot's immoral neighbours disrespected him (especially verses 5-9). Even Lot's sons-in-law, who should have known him pretty well, thought he was joking when he warned them of the coming destruction.

Ultimately, only Lot and his daughters escaped. Even Lot's wife didn't survive. Looking back at her former home, perhaps longing for what she was leaving behind, she was turned into a pillar of salt.

Sometimes, in trying to stay in contact with our non-Christian friends, we act like Lot. We compromise, hoping to stay culturally relevant to dead culture. But we lose in two ways. Our friends are no closer to God, and they have no respect for us either.

I'm not suggesting that you dump your non believing friends. God can use you to reach them. But don't forget who your best Friend is.

Otherwise, you might end up a two-time loser like Lot. —JC

Before we can discuss any standard or issue there are three imperatives:


1. We must be Christains; seeking _
