Our senator however, was usually seen lingering after the meeting, folding and stacking chairs--and he was the highest ranking official there! He was simply making the caretaker's job easier.

When we serve from the heart outward, not calculating or grandstanding, we are humble. It's not an act of pretentious piety but a deed of sensitivity and compassion. We won't even be aware of it because we're doing it naturally (ie supernaturally). That's what humility is all about. --DE

# I Peter: Overcoming Suffering Humility.

(Psalms 42:7) .. All Your waves and billows have gone over me.

In 1 Peter 5:5-7 there are two commands to be humble and 4 outcomes of having that humility:

(Philippians 2:8-11) "And being found in appearance as a man, He humbled Himself and became obedient to the point of death, even the death of the cross. {9} Therefore God also has highly exalted Him and given Him the name which is above every name, {10} that at the name of Jesus every knee should bow, of those in heaven, and of those on earth, and of those under the earth, {11} and that every tongue should confess that Jesus Christ is Lord, to the glory of God the Father."



(John 13:3-5) "Jesus, knowing that the Father had given all things into His hands, .. {4} rose from supper and laid aside His garments, took a towel and girded Himself. {5} After that, He poured water into a basin and began to wash the disciples' feet, and to wipe them with the towel with which He was girded."
