(Luke 7:40-47) "And Jesus answered and said to him, "Simon, I have something to say to you." So he said, "Teacher, say it." [41] "There was a certain creditor who had two debtors. One owed five hundred denarii, and the other fifty. {42} "And when they had nothing with which to repay, he freely forgave them both. Tell Me, therefore, which of them will love him more?" {43} Simon answered and said, "I suppose the one whom he forgave more." And He said to him, "You have rightly judged." [44] Then He turned to the woman and said to Simon, "Do you see this woman? I entered your house; you gave Me no water for My feet, but she has washed My feet with her tears and wiped them with the hair of her head. {45} "You gave Me no kiss, but this woman has not ceased to kiss My feet since the time I came in. [46] "You did not anoint My head with oil, but this woman has anointed My feet with fragrant oil. {47} "Therefore I say to you, her sins, which are many, are forgiven, for she loved much. But to whom little is forgiven, the same loves little.""





Godliness is profitable for all things, having promise of the life that now is and of that which is to come. —1 Timothy 4:8

I read with interest the newspaper ad about a thermostat that automatically adjusts the temperature of a house to the appropriate level, day or night. If what the ad claims is true, the thermostat will pay for itself in energy savings within 1 year. When I multiply that savings by the projected life of the unit, it is obviously to my advantage to buy it. Yet interestingly enough, I find that I'm hesitant to spend the money today to purchase the unit. But why, if it is such a value?


This question has a spiritual counterpart. I find that at times I can be slow to expend the faith needed to make wise long-range spiritual investments. Even though I know God stands behind every claim He makes, my reluctance to trust Him reveals how self-centred I can be.

Because even believers in Christ can become spiritually short sighted and unwilling to pay the

price of commitment to the Lord. Paul reminded Timothy to make every effort to be an example to the believers "in word, in conduct, in love, in spirit, in faith, in purity" (v.12). That requires effort and discipline, but the apostle was convinced that anyone who chooses to invest in godliness will find that his decision more than pays for itself both in this life and in the life to come (v.8). — MRDII

(Titus 1:1) "Paul, a bondservant of God and an apostle of Jesus Christ, according to ...the acknowledgment of the truth which accords with godliness,"

(Acts 10:2) "a devout man and one who feared God with all his household, ..."

(1 Timothy 2:2) "for kings and all who are in authority, that we may lead a quiet and peaceable life in all godliness and reverence."

(1 Timothy 5:4) "But if any widow has children or grandchildren, let them first learn to show

piety at home and to repay their parents; ..."

(2 Timothy 3:12) "Yes, and all who desire to live godly in Christ Jesus will suffer persecution."

(1 Timothy 6:3-5) "If anyone teaches otherwise and does not consent to wholesome words.. and to the doctrine which accords with godliness. {4} he is proud. knowing nothing, .. {5} .. and destitute of the truth, who suppose that godliness is a means of gain.

From such withdraw yourself." (2 Timothy 3:4-5) ".. lovers of pleasure rather than lovers of God, {5} having a form of godliness but denving its power. And from such people turn away!"

(Hebrews 11:32-38) "And what more shall I say? For the time would fail me to tell of Gideon and Barak and Samson and Jephthah, also of David and Samuel and the prophets: .. {35} ... And others were tortured, not accepting deliverance, that they might *obtain a better resurrection. {36} Still others had trial of mockings* and scourgings, yes, and of chains and imprisonment. [37] They were stoned, they were sawn in two, were tempted, were slain with the sword. They wandered about in sheepskins and goatskins, being destitute, afflicted, tormented; {38} of whom the world was not worthy. They wandered in deserts and mountains, in dens and caves of the earth.
