nursing.

The patriarch Job in the Bible is another person who wanted to die more than anything else. Just as Florence Nightingale came out of her night and found ways to help others in physical distress, so too Job lived through his grief. His example has helped many turn in faith to God in their darkest hour.

What about you? Maybe this article has reached you at a time when you'd just as soon not go on living. Because you are a believer in Christ, you feel even more despondent. You wonder how a Christian can have such dark thoughts of hopelessness and death.

Don't give up! Coming to the end of yourself may be just what you need. It forces you to turn to Christ for the courage to keep on going and for a good reason to keep on living.

You may never turn out to be a Florence Nightingale. But you can do something to ease human suffering and help your fellowman. Decide now to start over. God often uses what seems to be the end of it all to initiate a new beginning. --MD

2 Peter:

Overcoming Error The Value of the Word III

In 2 Peter 1:12-21 Peter, returning to the subject of truth, gives us four more reasons to value the Word of God:

- 1. The Word is valuable because it reminds us of truth, verses 5-15
- 2. The Word is valuable because it records eyewitness evidence, verses 16-18
- 3. The Word is valuable because it speaks to our deepest needs, verses 19-21

(Isaiah 53:3-4) "He is despised and rejected by men, A Man of sorrows and acquainted with grief. And we hid, as it were, our faces from Him; He was despised, and we did not esteem Him. {4} Surely He has borne our griefs And carried our sorrows; Yet we esteemed Him stricken, Smitten by God, and afflicted."

(Luke 19:41) "Now as He drew near, He saw the city and wept over it,"

(John 11:35) "Jesus wept."

(Psalms 32:3) "When I kept silent, my bones grew old Through my groaning all the day long."
(Psalms 38:8) "I am feeble and severely broken; I groan because of the turmoil of my heart."
(Psalms 42:3-7) "My tears have been my food day and night, While they continually say to me,
"Where is your God?" {4} When I remember these things, I pour out my soul within me. ... {5} Why
are you cast down, O my soul? And why are you disquieted within me? ..." ... {7} ... All Your waves
and billows have gone over me."

(Job 3:24-26) "For my sighing comes before I eat, And my groanings pour out like water. [25] For the thing I greatly feared has come upon me, And what I dreaded has happened to me. [26] I am not at ease, nor am I quiet; I have no rest, for trouble comes.""

(<u>Proverbs 12:25)</u> "Anxiety in the heart of man causes depression, But a good word makes it glad."
