community that such associations create.

In every activity, we must distinguish between participation and involvement. The Christian life is the same way. You might attend church from time to time, and fish out a devotional when you need a spiritual jolt.

But you also need to get involved! Sure, involvement costs, but it is also an investment. As you invest yourself in the spiritual life of your church, you are building connectedness-- and that benefits you and the Christians around you.

God designed the body of Christ to be just that-- a body. We are not supposed to be a test tube, filled with one-celled organisms-- amoebas occasionally swimming past each other. We are one body, which gains strength when we work as one.


So what are you doing with your time? Consider increasing your <u>investment</u> in your local church. That is one 'mutual fund' that promises great returns, for you *and* those around you!

Bowling Alone

"The problem with the United States is that people are bowling more, but membership in bowling leagues is decreasing."

Okay, maybe that's not the only problem in the US-- but it is a conclusion of Robert D. Putnam from Harvard University.

Putnam's point, in fact, is a little more complex. He points out that, historically, we in the west, have had a reputation for gathering-- town meetings, company picnics, groups like the Rotary club. As society has changed, however, we have lost our connectedness-- in the public arena, in social contacts, and even in spiritual matters. The result is a loss of
