6. Do you sincerely consider meeting this person's needs to be more important than meeting your own? (Today's sermon)

- 7. Do you readily forgive this person when he or she irritates or offends you?
- 8. Do you patiently allow this person to make mistakes without letting it anger you or damage the relationship?
- 9. Do you allow this person genuine freedom to be himself in your presence—without putting undue pressure on him to change?
- 10. Are you able to avoid tension and conflict in your relationship?
- 11. Do the two of you have essentially the same moral values, the same love for God and his word, and the same basic desire to live for Christ?
- 12. Are you fully honest with this person?
- 13. Whenever you happen to offend this person or think you may have hurt his or her feelings, do you seek quickly to confess and make it right?
- 14. Do you actively try to build up this person?
- 15. Do you seek to be reconciled with this person when he sins against you?
- 16. Do you make it a habit to meet his or her personal needs as you become aware of them?
- 17. Do you understand and feel the hardships this person experiences?
- 18. Do you provide comfort when he or she is experiencing sorrow?
- 19. Do you challenge this person in a positive way to live a pure, holy, and obedient life?
- 20. Do you pray for this person?
- 21. Do you provide enough time and attention to make this person feel comfortable in your presence, and do you make your possessions available for his use?
