to remain hidden, so that nothing diverts our gaze from the Lord Jesus.

Whenever we focus our attention on Christ, the Holy Spirit is in close partnership with us. The Spirit is pleased when we are glorifying the Lord. We can do this by:

- Remembering what Christ did for us by observing the Lord's Supper (1 Corinthians 11:23-26).
- Making Jesus our example (John 13:15; Philippians 2:5-11; 1 Peter 2:21-24).
- Longing to know Christ better, so that we may be more like Him (Philippians 3:10-14).
- Not being afraid of dying because we're looking forward to being with Christ (2 Corinthians 5:8; Philippians 1:21-23; 2 Timothy 4:6-8).
- Living in awareness of the day we will appear at "the judgment seat of Christ" (2 Corinthians 5:10).
- Being comforted by the fact that Christ is our intercessor in heaven (Hebrews 4:14-16).
- Purifying ourselves from sin as we're living in the light of Christ's return (1 John 3:2,3).
- Looking forward to Christ's rule over the earth (Isaiah 2:1-4; Jeremiah 23:5,6; Revelation 20:1-4).
- Rejoicing in the assurance that every mortal being in God's universe will bow before Jesus Christ and confess Him as Lord (Philippians 2:9-11).

The Holy Spirit keeps Himself out of the limelight so that Christ may be honoured. He is pleased when we praise and adore the Lord Jesus. He views us as partners with Him in glorifying Christ. Being Christ-centred, therefore, is an essential in being

filled with the Spirit.
