Yet how many times have we rushed off to church—for a time of worshiping God—with a mess of sorts hanging all over our hearts? Maybe we had a fight with our spouse during the week, and we haven't spoken for days. Or perhaps we are still carrying the burden of the conversation-turned-argument that we had with our parents, leaving a dark cloud of anger.

One Sunday morning before church, I heard someone confess her attitude the previous day and the impatient way she had treated everyone. Her words had a powerful effect on both her and those she had hurt. And she had cleaned off the mess before going to church.

That situation reminded me of what Jesus said in Matthew 5:23-24. When we come before God to worship Him, we need to stop fooling ourselves. Hypocrites need not apply for the role of worshipper. God is not deceived by nice-sounding words or a holy-looking exterior on Sunday morning. He knows our hearts. That's why Jesus told His followers to make things right with others, to reconcile with those we have hurt before coming to the Lord in worship.

So, before we approach God and begin to praise Him, let's make sure that we're not covered with the mess of hurt that we have caused others, or with bitter anger. With His help we can come before Him with hearts that are wholly holy. —Kurt DeHaan
