
(Revelation 13:16-17) He causes all, both small and great, rich and poor, free and slave, to receive a mark on their right hand or on their foreheads, (17)



2 Kings 23:34. 35. 36. 37

(Jeremiah 22:18) Therefore thus says the LORD concerning Jehojakim ...: "They shall not lament for him

(Jeremiah 26:1-8) In the beginning of the reign of Jehoiakim ... this word came from the LORD. saying, ... (6) .. I will make this house like Shiloh, and will make this city a curse to all the nations of the earth." '"...(8) Now it happened, when Jeremiah had made an end of speaking ...all the people seized him, saving, "You will surely die!

(Jeremiah 25:1, 9) The word that came to Jeremiah concerning all the people of Judah, ...(9) behold, I will send and take all the families of the north,' says the LORD, 'and Nebuchadnezzar the king of Babylon, My servant, and will bring them against this land, against its inhabitants, and against these nations all around, and will utterly destroy them, and make them an astonishment, a

(*Jeremiah* 26:23) And they brought Urijah from Egypt and brought him to Jehoiakim the king, who killed him with the sword ..

(*Jeremiah 36:22-23*) Now the king was sitting in the winter house .. with a fire burning on the hearth before him. (23) And it happened, when Jehudi had read three or four columns, that the king cut it with the scribe's knife and cast it into the fire that was on the hearth, until all the scroll was consumed in the fire that was on the hearth.

• 2 Kings 24:1-3

(2 Chronicles 36:6-7) Nebuchadnezzar king of Babylon came up against him, and bound him in bronze fetters to carry him off to Babylon. (7) Nebuchadnezzar also carried off some of the articles from the house of the LORD to Babylon, and put them in his temple at Babylon.

• 2 Kings 24:6, 8, 10-11, 13-14, 16-20

(2 Chronicles 36:13-16) And he also rebelled against King Nebuchadnezzar, who had made him swear an oath by God; but he .. hardened his heart against turning to the LORD God of Israel. (14) Moreover all the leaders of the priests and the people transgressed more and more, according to all the abominations of the nations, and defiled the house of the LORD which He had consecrated in Jerusalem. (15) And the LORD God of their fathers sent warnings to them by His messengers, rising up early and sending them, because He had compassion on His people and on His dwelling place. (16) But they mocked the messengers of God, despised His words, and scoffed at His prophets, until the wrath of the LORD arose against His people, till there was no remedy.

• 2 Kings25:1-4, 7

(2 Chronicles 36:17-21) Therefore He brought against them the king of the Chaldeans, who killed their young men with the sword in the house of their sanctuary, and had no compassion on young man or virgin, on the aged or the weak; He gave them all into his hand. (18) And all the articles from the house of God, great and small, the treasures of the house of the LORD, and the treasures of the king and of his leaders, all these he took to Babylon. (19) Then they burned the house of God, broke down the wall of Jerusalem, burned all its palaces with fire, and destroyed all its precious possessions. (20) And those who escaped from the sword he carried away to Babylon, where they became servants to him and his sons until the rule of the kingdom of Persia, (21) to fulfill the word of the LORD by the mouth of Jeremiah, until the land had enjoyed her Sabbaths. As long as she lay desolate she kept Sabbath, to fulfill seventy years.

From the last chapters of 2 Kings and 2 Chronicles there are 6 lessons to highlight:

1. Trust; not ____, 2 Kings 24:1 (*Proverbs 29:25*) The fear of man brings a snare, But whoever trusts in the LORD shall be safe.



(Isaiah 30:2) Who .. go down to Egypt, And have not asked My advice, To strengthen themselves in the strength of Pharaoh, And to trust in the shadow of Egypt!


(Jeremiah 46:25) The LORD of hosts, the God of Israel, says: "Behold, I will bring punishment on .. Pharaoh and Egypt, with their gods and their kings; Pharaoh and those who trust in him. (Proverbs 3:5-6) Trust in the LORD with all your heart, And lean not on your own understanding; (6) In all your ways acknowledge Him, And He shall direct your paths.

(Jeremiah 44:3) because of their wickedness


