silence of the Lamb.

One of the Sherlock Holmes stories, *Silver Blaze*, hinges on the clue of silence. A prized, extremely valuable racehorse was stolen in the night. The thief was successful because the well-trained watchdog guarding the stall did not bark. The significance of the dog's silence became clear late in the story, when Holmes identified the thief as a friend of the family. The dog did not consider him to be an intruder, so he remained silent during the break-in.


Writing 700 years before the coming of the Messiah, the prophet Isaiah said silence would be a clue to His identity. "As a sheep before her shearers is silent, so He did not open His mouth" (53:7). This vital piece of information remained obscure until the trial of Jesus. When He was taken before the Sanhedrin and falsely accused, Jesus "remained silent and gave no answer" (Mark 14:61).

The clue of silence fits. And when you add to it many other Old Testament clues--His birth in Bethlehem (Micah 5:2), His lineage from David (Isaiah 11:10; Luke 3:31), <u>His virgin birth (Isaiah 7:14; Matthew 1:23)</u>, the casting of lots for His clothes (Psalm 22:18; John 19:23-24), and hundreds of other clues, the mystery of Jesus' identity is solved. He is exactly who He claimed to be: The Messiah of Israel, prophesied so many centuries before, who came to be the Savior of the world.

And because He is all He claimed to be, He is worthy of our trust and our praise. --DE

- How could I use this information to witness to inquiring friends? To unsaved Jewish people?



Matthew 10:28 And do not fear those who kill the body but cannot kill the soul. But rather fear Him who is able to destroy both soul and body in hell.



2. The right , verses 10-16, 8:3-4
<u>Matthew 1:18-25</u> — 18 Now the birth of Jesus Christ was as follows: After His mother Mary was betrothed to Joseph, before they came together, she was found with child of the Holy Spirit. 19 Then Joseph her husband, being a just man, and not wanting to make her a public example, was minded to put her away secretly. 20 But while he thought about these things, behold, an angel of
