

Luke 22:14 When the hour had come, He sat down, and the twelve apostles with Him. (Matthew 26:20 When evening had come, He sat down with the twelve.)

We now come to the eve of the cross. The evening begins with washing the **W** disciples' feet. So we note, that there are three steps toward humble service:

, John 13:1-4 <u>Psalm 90:2</u> Before the mountains were brought forth, Or ever You had formed the earth and the world, Even from everlasting to everlasting, You are God.


